This PFT machine combination stores large quantities of mixed material and thus permits long application times without constant interruptions for the mixing of new material.

XXL Machine Combination for a Large Supply of Material



"Be your own man," master builder Frank Siebert thought to himself in 1998 and established his own clay construction business.

Numerous reference projects, accomplished either manually or with the aid of machines, prove that Mr. Siebert is really a master in his trade. A short while ago, he decided to purchase better and, above all, user-friendlier equipment. It was important to him to have a machine combination that would mix and store larger quantities of material, so that he had more time for the application of the material and did not have to waste half of his working

time on mixing new earth-moist clay plaster.

PFT MAXIMIX Combined with PFT ZP 3 long

At www.pft.de, Frank Siebert found what he was looking for. He chose a compulsory mixer and a conveying pump by PFT, which exactly met his requirements. In a consultation with the local PFT partner trader Moog GmbH, based in Paderborn (North Germany), an appointment was made to test the machine combination at a building site. The demonstration of the

PFT ZP 3 long conveying pump, with its large material container, and the PFT MAXIMIX compulsory mixer immediately convinced Mr. Siebert of the benefits of this combination. These two machines offered a material capacity of approx. 360 litres altogether.



In one-man operation, Frank Siebert can apply large amounts of plaster without constantly having to mix new material.



The material is conveyed by the PFT T 10 1.5 screw pump integrated in the PFT ZP 3 long.

The Tailor-Made Solution

Mr. Siebert further improved this combination by adding an extension hopper, which increased the volume by approx. 200 litres. Thanks to this clever kind of self-help, Mr. Siebert now has exactly the equipment that he had in mind. He can plaster for a long time without constantly having to interrupt his work to mix new material. ■
